Legislative Committee January 16, 2025

To all members of the Legislative Committee, the total number of bills introduced is 9,920 already for this session. There were 61 new bills added since the last report, I added 7 new bills to our tracking lists (see attached). The total number of our tracked bills stayed the same at 297, with 166 bills in Fire & Emergency Services, 73 bills in Firemen's Home, and 58 bills in Pensions. There are currently twenty-five bills sitting on The Governor's Desk waiting to be signed. Two of our tracked bills are currently sitting on the Governor's Desk waiting to be signed. The Governor signed one hundred fifteen bills into law to date.

Just to note two of the newly added tracked bills are A-5160, which provides PERS members and certain retirees the same benefits provided to members enrolled in retirement system before July 1, 2007 (this will remove all the Tiers and make all members only Tier 1 once the bill is approved) & A-5175, which reinstates automatic COLAs for retirement benefits of certain PERS members.

One of our bills is listed to be heard today in the Assembly Regulated Professions Committee, A-4266, which requires that certain fire escape inspections be performed by structural engineer or employee with certified fire escape inspection company. There is also an Assembly Quorum Call for Thursday, January 23, 2025, however they have not yet posted the list of committees or bills that will be heard.
