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Legislative Committee

January 30, 2025

To all members of the Legislative Committee, the total number of bills introduced is 9,966 already for this session. There were 38 new bills added since the last report. I added one new bill into our tracking list, Fire & Emergency Services, A-5223, which requires manufacturer of firefighting personal protective equipment containing perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances to provide written notice to purchaser. The total number of our tracked bills is now at 298, with 167 bills in Fire & Emergency Services, 73 bills in Firemen's Home, and 58 bills in Pensions. There are currently eight bills sitting on The Governor's Desk waiting to be signed. One of our tracked bills is currently sitting on the Governor's Desk waiting to be signed. The Governor signed one hundred thirty-two bills into law to date. One of our tracked bills was signed by the Governor today, S-684, which requires telecommunications, cable television, and Internet service providers to allow for service contracts to be paused or canceled following service recipients' admission to long-term care facility.

On Monday, January 27, 2025, in the Assembly Public Safety and Preparedness Committee, A-2145, which provides employment protections for paid first responders diagnosed with post-traumatic stress disorder under certain conditions, reported out of committee and referred to the Assembly Labor Committee. This morning two of our tracked bills were heard in the Senate Transportation Committee, A-4284 & S-3366, which eliminates fee for special plates for firefighters and members of first aid or rescue squads. Both bills were approved and reported out of committee. On Monday, February 3, 2025, two of our tracked bills are listed to be heard in committee meetings. S-3286, which provides gross income tax credit to active members of volunteer emergency service organizations for use of personal motor vehicle in performance of active duty, will be heard in the Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee. S-1416, which requires DOH to develop Statewide Emergency Medical Services Plan, will be heard in the Senate Health, Human Services, and Senior Citizens Committee.
