# Legislative Committee June 26, 2025

To all members of the Legislative Committee, the total number of bills introduced is 11,209 already for this session. There were 162 new bills added since the last report, I added 7 new bills to our tracking lists (see attached). The total number of our tracked bills is now 335, with 198 bills in Fire & Emergency Services, 76 bills in Firemen's Home, and 61 bills in Pensions. There are currently fourteen bills sitting on the Governor's Desk waiting to be signed. The Governor signed one hundred eighty-six bills into law to date.

There are Both Assembly and Senate Budget Committee Meetings on the schedule for today. Some of our tracked bills are listed to be heard (see attached). On Monday, June 30, 2025, there are both Assembly and Senate Voting Sessions on the schedule. Some of our tracked bills are listed to be heard (see attached).

I wrote a support Letter for Federal Legislation for the Helper Act, HR 2904 & S-978 (see attached). I have written in support of this act in the past and I was asked again as these bills have been recently reintroduced for the new Federal Legislative Session.

Just a reminder the State Office will be closed next week for the Fourth Of July Holiday. The State Office will reopen on Monday, July 7, 2025.

## Dear Speaker Johnson, Majority Leader Thune, Leader Jeffries, and Leader Schumer:

I am honored to write in strong support of the Homes for Every Local Protector, Educator, and Responder (HELPER) Act. H.R.2904 and S.978 were introduced in March of 2025 as a bipartisan, bicameral bill, with endorsements from dozens of national, state, and local organizations and elected officials.

The HELPER Act would establish a home loan program within the Federal Housing Administration to make homeownership more affordable for law enforcement officers, firefighters, EMTs, paramedics, and preK-12 teachers—our nation's first responders. We honor their dedication by providing access to affordable housing, enabling them to care for their families while continuing to serve their communities.

We hope you will join New Jersey State Firemen's Association in supporting the HELPER Act, and we look forward to working with you on this vital issue.
